1. Summary Report from the answers of CHAIN workshop-participants (1st part)

Title: Personal Teaching Wishes and Goals of Educators

Key Themes:

1. Innovative Education Techniques:

- o Emphasis on integrating **digital tools** such as gamification, AI, and virtual teaching aids.
- Strong interest in adopting blended learning methods to combine physical and virtual education effectively.

2. Student-Centered Learning:

- Focus on learner-centered education that aligns with industry needs and enhances employability skills.
- o Proposals for **interactive teaching** to make lessons more practical, engaging, and meaningful.

3. Infrastructure and Resources:

- o Advocacy for **adequate learning spaces**, modern teaching aids, and better equipment for technical and engineering courses.
- Suggestions for creating robust educational programs with clear course objectives and interdisciplinary integration.

4. Collaboration and Exchange:

- o Calls for **co-teaching**, both within and across borders, and **collaborations with industries** for practical learning and internships.
- Interest in internationalizing education through faculty and student exchanges.

5. Funding and Support:

 Highlighted the need for sustainable funding to improve infrastructure, digital tools, and personnel compensation.

- Inspire design thinking as a lifelong skill.
- Create a legacy of impactful teaching tied to community challenges.

2. Summary Report from the answers of CHAIN workshop-participants (2nd part)

Title: Impediments to Modern Education and Technology Integration

Key Challenges Identified:

1. Infrastructure Issues:

- o Unstable electricity and poor internet connectivity hinder ICT adoption.
- o Lack of modern facilities, including labs and teaching equipment.

2. Financial Constraints:

- o Insufficient budget allocations to education sectors.
- o High cost of technology and internet access.
- o Financial difficulties faced by students and institutions.

3. Resistance to Change:

- o Rigid attitudes and fear of job displacement among educators.
- Skepticism about the efficacy of digital tools.

4. Equity and Accessibility:

- o Unequal access to devices and connectivity exacerbates the digital divide.
- o Socioeconomic disparities limit opportunities for low-income students.

5. Motivational Barriers:

- o Low morale due to poor remuneration and uncomfortable working conditions.
- o Lack of institutional support for faculty professional development.

6. Broader Systemic Issues:

- o Frequent disruptions caused by strikes and funding delays.
- o Inadequate international exposure to best practices in education.

Suggestions for Improvement:

- Prioritize better funding and infrastructure development.
- Conduct training programs for educators to enhance ICT skills.
- Foster institutional leadership and policy reforms to drive innovation.




